# Message from the ASCO President:

October is generally known as the month of haunts, scares, ghouls, leaves changing color and falling from the trees, and the first frost of the year settling in. There's more to the month than that, though. Below you will find just three of the many things celebrated in the month of October. The most well known is **Breast Cancer Awareness Month**. The lifetime risk of getting breast cancer is 1 in 8 and it's the second leading cause of cancer death for American women. Early detection is crucial for effective treatment and survival. Self-exams can be done at home very easily and if you find something that feels abnormal, call your doctor and make an appointment. They'll do a manual exam and likely order a mammogram to make sure there's not something they missed. Although October has been designated as Breast Cancer Awareness Month, women (as well as men – 400 men die each year from breast cancer) should be on the offensive and stay aware of their bodies. Of great concern in our country is **Domestic Violence** Awareness. Victims of domestic violence know what it's like to live in fear or lose themselves behind a facade. But there is help and resources available to victims. The website for the National Collation Against Domestic Violence, www.ncadv.org, is a good place to start and is full of information, news, updates, events and postings. However, this is an issue that should not be focused on just for one month out of the year. Thousands are victims of domestic violence and more needs to be done to help them, even if all that can be offered at the time is a shelter and someone to listen. Lastly, our 4 legged friends need help as well so October is **Adopt A Shelter Dog Month**. According to the ASPCA, at least 12 million dogs go to shelters each year. Many, more than half, are euthanized because of lack of space and resources, and lack of willing adopters. Adopting a dog is a great thing to do but be sure that you do your research ahead of time and that you're truly ready to become a dog owner - it's a lot of work! Go to a site like petfinder.com and look for your local shelter. Your new best friend is waiting
