Reports and Recommendations by Mayor and Officials: Reports of Officials:

Scott Wahl reported the 2018 Budget for the Joint Insurance Fund (JIF) was approved at the Executive Board Meeting held November 20, 2017. The budget will result in a 3% decrease in spending by the JIF, which will realize a refund to the participating municipalities. The budget decrease contributed heavily to the ability of municipalities to buy into various safety programs which help to provide safer working environments and reduced expenses. Mr. Miola will be invited to a future Council Meeting to discuss this matter further. Earlier today, a meeting was held with Tom Thornton, Steve Morey, and the Mayor to discuss a long term plans, as the Borough now has a spirit of cooperation with the US Army Corp of Engineers that will possibly allow the Borough to maintain the Graven's Island CDF Road for future dredging projects. The Army Corp originally resisted the opportunity to have a regional facility that could be used by other interests. The Corp has now had a change of heart and is now of the opinion that a regional CDF makes most sense for practicality to keep waterways safely dredged. That permit application is being made. He commended Bill Macomber, Steve Camp, and all employees of Public Works for a job well done constructing a reindeer barn.

Dr. Lapuma reported he recently spoke at the Avalon Public Library regarding the Sea Watch program. Attendees of the Sea Watch have been tallied each year from September 22nd through December 22nd for the past 24 years. In 2015, there were 250 attendees, and in 2016, there were 1,200 attendees. So far this season, there have been over 1,200 attendees with a month left in the season. He attributed the large rise in numbers to the construction of a sea-watching structure on the beach between 8th and 9th Streets. So far this year, there have been approximately 520,000 water birds tallied. On average, between 750,000 and 1,000,000 are tallied each year. He encouraged all to come out to the Sea Watch before the end of the season. He also reported the Wetlands Institute recently hosted its Cape May Fall Festival, which primarily takes place in Cape May, however attendees are encouraged to venture to the Avalon Sea Watch. The event had over 3,500 attendees in Cape May, with a high percentage of the crowd coming to Avalon that day. Also, the Wetlands Institute hosted the 2nd International Bird Observatory Conference, which had attendees from all over the world. All attendees of the conference visited the Sea Watch in Avalon and were very impressed by the program. He thanked Council for their support in this venture.
