Reports and Recommendations by Mayor and Officials: Reports of Officials:

Scott Wahl read the following report:

New Ambulance: The Avalon Rescue Squad purchased, and is in receipt of, a new 2018 Ford E450 Horton ambulance. The ambulance cost approximately \$217,000 and was financed 100% through donations to the Avalon Rescue Squad. The ambulance has the largest patient care area of any unit in southern New Jersey, and new state of the art safety features. The Rescue Squad is both humbled and appreciative of the donations over the past three years that have enabled the Squad to purchase the ambulance.

JIF Performance: Yesterday I attended the monthly JIF executive directors meeting and all member communities received updates on their performance and performance trends. In 2017, Avalon's total loss ratio was a low 33.7% which shows a trend down from 77.3% in 2013. This is directly attributable to the safety practices in the Borough which include but are not limited to the training of our staff and the monthly safety meetings when all topics related to safety are discussed. Avalon's loss rate is a full 20 percentage lower than the combined loss rate of the JIF. Some communities in the JIF are experiencing large claims which in some cases are transferred to the MEL, the Municipal Excess Liability fund. Since 2012, Avalon has had zero claims that needed MEL coverage.

#### **Public Comments:**

Martha Wright, 632 7<sup>th</sup> Street, spoke about floodplain management and predicted that 7<sup>th</sup> Street between Ocean Drive and the Yacht Club will be the next street to be lost to flooding. She noted there are no bulkheads on the north side of Fourth Avenue or Fifth Avenue, which attributes to the inlet flooding those street ends. She reported to Council that she lost two vehicles during the flooding event that resulted from the October 27, 2018 rainfall, and asked Council to ensure 7<sup>th</sup> Street is also being considered when reviewing the north end flooding. She spoke about the surrounding bodies of water in that area, namely Townsend's Inlet and Cornell Harbor, and wondered about the preventative measures that could be taken in such areas. She voiced the opinion that the size of the homes within Avalon as well as the impervious coverage contribute to flooding, and she suggested that the Floodplain Management Plan address the percolation of rainwater. She also suggested the Zoning Ordinance and Building Codes align with the Floodplain Management Plan.

Elaine Scattergood, 75 30<sup>th</sup> Street, advocated for a prohibition of construction activity on Sundays year-round, and asked Council to also consider possibly restricting construction to Monday through Friday only year-round. She noted there have been talks in the community of a possible settlement agreement with homeowners that did not receive a proper home warranty, and asked that the Borough inform the public if such a settlement was made, and the amount of the settlement.
