Reports of Officials:

Scott Wahl read the following report:

Outside Dining/Retail: A meeting was held among our professionals in Borough Hall this morning to discuss the state and mayoral executive orders that permit both outside dining, the expansion of outdoor liquor licenses, and outside retail. Every application was reviewed by the Zoning Officer, Municipal Clerk, Police Chief, Code Enforcement Officer, and Administration. All applications received have complied with the spirit of the executive orders issued by Governor Murphy and Mayor Pagliughi, and only some non-substantive changes are needed for a few of the applications. This activity is allowed to begin on Monday, June 15th, at 6:00am.

Special Events: The Mayor and I had a long discussion over the past 24 hours regarding amendments to his executive orders relating to special events and outside Borough facilities. As you may know, the Governor has increased the number of people gathered outside to 100 immediately; with anticipated goals of 250 on June 22nd and 500 on July 3rd. With that being said amendments to his executive orders are as follows:

- -Beach movies, which typically draw 300-400 people, will be allowable as of Tuesday, July 7th.
- -Sports camps will be allowed for non-contact sports activities starting Monday, June 22nd.
- -Full play at tennis and pickleball courts, with all courts open, will begin Monday, June 15th.
- -Fireworks remain cancelled. Our crowd around the 30th Street beach is typically 5,000 people, ten times the allowable anticipated limit by the Governor.
- -Bay Atlantic Symphony July 4th concert remains cancelled as the new allowable indoor limit is only 50 people. We typically get 700 guests.
- -The Chamber of Commerce may have Thursdays on Dune activities if they see fit to do so.
- -The Sundays at Surfside concerts are off for the summer. With social distancing, the anticipated maximum attendance would be 100 or fewer.

Beach tags are still not needed until July 3rd. Our beach ambassador program continues weekends until then. Our police patrols on the beach to encourage social distancing continue 11
