Public comments regarding Resolutions:

Martha Wright, 632 7th Street, referenced the Resolution authorizing Middlesex Water Company to solicit bids to replace and install all water meters and inquired if homeowners would have the option to convert to different size water meters at no charge during the changeover.

<u>Council President McCorristin</u> replied the question will be referred to Ken Koches and further mentioned when water meter sizes are changed, the lines to the meters would also need to be changed.

Martha Wright asked about the timeline regarding this project.

<u>Scott Wahl</u> explained the Borough will solicit bids within the next few weeks and all new meters will be installed by June 2021, provided the Borough awards a contract based on bids received.

<u>Martha Wright</u> asked if homeowners will be notified as to when their water will be turned off and questioned how long the conversion to a new meter would take.

<u>Scott Wahl</u> replied the water at each home will be shut off for approximately 3 minutes for the conversion.

Martha Wright inquired if this will change the way water meters are read.

<u>Scott Wahl</u> mentioned this item was discussed at the August 12, 2020 Work Session. A customer portal application will be available to property owners via phone or computer. Customers will have instant data, which will come straight from the meter.

Reports and Recommendations by Mayor and Officials: Reports of Officials:

Scott Wahl read the following report:

<u>Bid openings</u>: On August 18, 2020, the Borough solicited bids for lease of space on the 3100 Dune Drive municipal tower & ground space for the placement of a small cell antenna project. On August 26, 2020, the Borough solicited bids for Reconstruction of Various Streets, which includes Sunrise Drive and 69th Street. Eight bids were submitted to the Borough of Avalon for consideration. All of which were competitive and favorable to the Borough.

<u>County Projects</u>: Administration has confirmed with the Cape May County Engineer, Robert Church, the Ingram's Thorofare re-decking project scheduled to begin the week of September 14, 2020. This project will run from September 2020 to Spring 2021. A temporary traffic signal will be used during construction to maintain one lane of travel. The bridge will be open to two lanes during the construction shut down periods.

Cape May County intends to apply for federal funding for the continuation of the Ocean Drive repaving and drainage project. The initial phase of the project covered 28th Street to 62nd Street; the second phase will cover 62nd Street South to 80th Street. This project is anticipated to begin in 2022.

AHLOA: I wish to publicly thank our partners at the Avalon Home and Land Owners Association for constant communication and outreach during the pandemic. Unfortunately, the pandemic did not allow the Mayor to make his annual State of the Borough address this month. However, it is my understanding that the Mayor is completing a comprehensive presentation to AHLOA along with a video that AHLOA will place on its website in lieu of a presentation. Of course, I will share the Mayor's presentation on our municipal website as well.

Environmental Commission: Dr. Brian Reynolds, after 20 years of Chairmanship of the Environmental Commission, has stepped down as Chairman. However, he is staying as an active member of the Environmental Commission and Avalon Planning/Zoning Board. It is a Mayoral appointment, and he has appointed Donna Rothman to be the new Chairperson of the Environmental Commission. She is very excited to take on that role and Donna and I will have a meeting tomorrow morning to go over various environmental ideas and programs that we have in the Borough.
