APPROVED LIST OF VEGETATION FOR LIVING FENCES

The following is a list of trees, shrubs and vines that have been used for living fences. If the living fence is properly designed, installed and maintained, it will provide service to the property owner for many years.

Under the Comment section of the list, C = climbing on lattice, F = flowering is significant, N = native species, S = spreading growth form, T = has thorns, U = upright, W = wildlife and ST = salt tolerant.

All plants in this list are known to survive in Hardiness Zone 7. Several species are drought tolerant and resistant to pests and diseases.

No shrub may exceed a height of eight (8) feet when mature.
