Reports and Recommendations by Mayor and Officials: Reports of Officials:

Scott Wahl gave the following report:

<u>COVID-19</u>: As of Wednesday, February 24th, 2021, 9,284 vaccinations have been provided at Avalon Community Hall by the Cape May County Department of Health. There have been 25,673 total vaccinations administered in Cape May County. There have been 6,730 cases of the virus in Cape May County during the pandemic, along with 177 deaths. Shots continue to be administered by the County at Avalon Community Hall four days a week. The focus continues to be on medical workers, public safety workers, and those aged 65 or older.

<u>Hydraulic Beach Fill:</u> Administration has been in contact with Senator Cory Booker's office regarding the need for a hydraulic beach fill in 2022. Administration has also been in contact with Warwick Consulting to ensure the Senator supports this beach nourishment program. Thus far, no documentation has been provided to show opposition to this project.

<u>County Dispatch:</u> The Avalon Police Department continues to work towards joining the centralized dispatch services provided by Cape May County. It is anticipated that the transition will occur on or about Monday, March 8, 2021. I thank the Police Department for their hard work and dedication.

<u>Verizon 5G:</u> Tuesday, February 23, 2021, I inspected the proposed draft list of utility pole locations from Verizon for the enhancement of wireless communications. Feedback has been provided to Verizon and Dominic Villecco, Telecommunications Consultant, V-COMM. It is intended to present Council with a final list of pole locations at the March 10, 2021 Council meeting.

Ingram's Thorofare Bridge: On Friday, February 19, Cape May County Engineer, Robert Church, released the following statement: The Ingrams Thorofare Bridge linking Middle Township and Avalon will be closed from 7 p.m. to 5 a.m. Tuesday through Thursday due to construction. Avalon Boulevard will be closed during these hours. The variable message sign says the bridge opens at 6:00 a.m. Robert Church has confirmed the bridge will open at 5:00 a.m.; the sign was programmed incorrectly.
