## ORDINANCE NO. 844-2022

## AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 15 OF THE AVALON BOROUGH CODE PERTAINING TO STREET OPENINGS AND THE ISSUANCE OF PERMITS

This Ordinance amends Chapter 15(Streets and Sidewalks) of the Borough Code, as herein described:

- Limits permit applicants to regulated New Jersey public utility companies and their contractors;
- Establishes two (2) types of permits: Minor Work and Major Work with separate fees schedules for each;
- Requires an escrow deposit to cover inspection fees for Major Work;
- Approves General Terms and Conditions applicable to each such permit;
- Classifies Borough Streets as either primary or secondary and restricts work on primary streets and requires compliance with Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices;
- Limits the number of openings in any given block within 36 months and then requires a full or partial resurface;
- Establishes administrative, civil as well as criminal penalties for violations and special provisions for the violation of a moratorium pertaining to newly paved streets;
- Establishes standards for restoration of streets and special criteria in certain circumstances;
- Establishes enforcement authority;
- Authorized the Director of DPW to adopt rules and regulations

Section 2 & 3: Provides that all inconsistent ordinances are repealed and that the provisions are severable.

Section 4: The Ordinance will take effect immediately.

This Ordinance was introduced and passed on first reading on June 8, 2022 and will be further considered for second reading, public hearing and final adoption on June 22, 2022 at the Municipal Building, 3100 Dune Drive, Avalon, NJ 08202 at 4:15 p.m.
