Reports and Recommendations by Mayor and Officials: Reports of Officials:

Scott Wahl read the following report:

<u>22ND Street Water Main Replacement:</u> The Borough's contractor, Perna Finnegan, will begin this capital project on Monday, February 13th. The project is anticipated to take four months, and will include the following areas: 22nd Street between 6th Street and Harbor Avenue; along with fourth, fifth, and sixth avenues between 21st and 22nd streets. The final asphalt paving surface will be put down in the fall. Notification has been made to the property owners and residents are asked not to park in the street when work is being conducted in their neighborhoods. Notification has been made on the municipal website.

<u>County Meeting:</u> On Friday, February 3rd I attended a meeting hosted by County Commission Director Len Desiderio that involved mayors and administrators from Cape May County. At the conclusion of the meeting, the County announced that it had secured \$18 million in American Rescue Plan Act funding that will be re-appropriated to municipalities who apply for the funding, and use the funding for infrastructure projects. Submissions must be made by March 10, 2023. Avalon would realize \$400,000 in grant funding for a project that could be used on a variety of infrastructure projects, and soft costs are eligible. This is a reimbursable grant program. With the Council President's approval, we intend to come before Council at the next meeting to discuss the use of this grant funding opportunity.

<u>Public Works:</u> For the first time in a very long time the Avalon Elementary School is fielding a baseball team this year. The Department of Public Works has been conducting major upgrades to the 12th Street baseball field since it has not been used for organized play for years. We are hopeful our community will take time to attend these games this year on a field that will look the best it's ever been when the season begins.

<u>Beach Fill Project:</u> A meeting was held in this room six hours ago to provide Avalon and Stone Harbor with an update on the upcoming beach fill. Here is the update:

The United States Army Corps of Engineers held a progress meeting in Avalon on February 8th. Avalon will be receiving a large beachfill project through a partnership with the Corps and the New Jersey Department of Environmental Protection. As of now, the start date of the project remains unchanged. The dredge "Texas" is finishing a project in Ocean City before it comes to Avalon. The anticipated mobilization date for equipment to the Avalon beachfront is March 10th, with an anticipated start date of pumping sand onto Avalon's north end beaches on or about March 20th.

Starting February 8th, a crew will be present on the Avalon beaches to conduct pre-construction surveys of the Avalon and Stone Harbor beachfronts. This work will take approximately five to six days to complete. You will notice some vehicles on the beach, and boats in the water, conducting the preconstruction, existing conditions. The vehicles will have a "GBA" logo on them. This will determine if Avalon is able to exercise four bid options in the contract. Avalon's portion of the work will be first, and Stone Harbor will be second.
